


TAMARIND VILLAGE



*Tranquil oasis in
downtown Chiang Mai...*

Tamarind Village is a 45-room Chiang Mai boutique hotel in the heart of town, right on the main Sunday Market Rajadamnoen Road and just a short tuk tuk ride from the night market in Chiang Mai.

Tamarind Village has heaps of character and consists of rooms set in two-storey buildings surrounding 3 neatly manicured leafy tropical garden courtyards and a magnificent 200-year old Tamarind tree.

The feeling is very peaceful and village-like and Tamarind Village's location means that

temples, shops, restaurants and architectural sites are close by.

Many guests spend lazy afternoons by the hotel swimming pool in the main garden.

Coming back to the hushed and intimate hotel after walking around the temples or markets feels a bit like coming back to a sylvan oasis of calm, especially walking through the bamboo tunnel entrance to the sight of the 200-year-old Tamarind tree.



What's so Special?

The atmosphere at Tamarind Village Chiang Mai is intimate, calm and sophisticated, as one would expect from the sister hotel of the luxurious Rayavadee in Krabi.

Tamarind Village has a great guided walking tour of nearby temples and local areas, which is popular with guests. There is also the opportunity to join in the daily alms offering to the Buddhist monks at a nearby temple.

Indeed the early morning alms procession trails right past the entrance to the hotel.

Tamarind Village Chiang Mai also offers a number of free activities including flower garland making, umbrella painting, bamboo weaving, Banana & Lotus Leaf Folding, Spa Herbal Compress Making and Tung 'Flag' Making.





The 25 Lanna Rooms (20 - 25 sq. m.) are situated on the ground floor and combine a rustic feel with a casual elegant design and are decorated in a fresh contemporary style that draws on the rich Lanna Thai tradition...



The 17 Lanna Deluxe Rooms (25 - 30 sq. m.) are on the first floors and offer a bit more space than the Lanna Rooms, whilst drawing on the same rustic northern Thai influences.

Brushed concrete floors and dark wood furniture are the hallmarks of these rooms which all have private balconies...



Tamarind Suites have separate living rooms and offer a comfortable living space with walls furnished with framed photos. Bathrooms have bathtubs...

Enter the Lanna Kingdom

Discover Chiang Mai

Chiang Mai is Thailand's second biggest city, a former capital of the old Lanna Kingdom and a great starting point for touring the north of Thailand.

Highlights of a stay in Chiang Mai include Chiang Mai's Night Bazaar and beautiful Wat Doi Suthep Temple.

Chiang Mai retains a relatively sleepy, provincial feeling and wandering the monasteries and temples of downtown Chiang Mai is a real highlight of a stay in the city.

Chiang Mai is a great base for touring the hilltribe region of Thailand and for soft adventure activities such as trekking and for seeing elephants in the north of Thailand.

Chiang Mai means 'New City' in Thai as it replaced Chiang Rai as the capital of the Lanna Kingdom in 1296 AD.

There are some wonderful boutique hotels in Chiang Mai, where it is easy to linger for lazy days on end.

We recommend at least a 3 night stay in Chiang Mai to experience Thailand's second city.

Tamarind Village is one of our favourite boutique hotels in Chiang Mai, in a great location for exploring Thailand's second city.

The location is ideal for exploring on foot and there are plenty of facilities close by.

Chiang Mai is known as the City of Temples, with over 200 temples scattered around town.

Since Chiang Mai's founding over 700 years ago successive Kings left their own mark on the city by building temples. That so many temples have survived is testament to both

the skills of the original builders and the dedication of the many artisans that followed to maintain them for future generations.

The temples today still form an important part in the lives of the Thai people and are in use daily.

The hilltop Wat Doi Suthep is one of the most magnificent temples in all of Thailand.



A Khantoke Dinner is a traditional northern Thai style of dining with meals served in large platters to guests seated on the floor around the table.

The 'khan tok' is the low wooden multi-legged tray on which the meal is served.

Khantoke dinners are available in many restaurants around Chiang Mai centre and also in the form of more organised dinner and shows, which although very staged for tourists are nevertheless a pleasant way to experience the unique Lanna style cuisine.

Northern Thailand is mountainous and home to some of the most stunning landscapes in Thailand as well as being home to the many hilltribes of Thailand.

Doi Inthanon is Thailand's highest mountain and a popular excursion from Chiang Mai.

Chiang Mai is a great base for enjoying some adventure activities in Thailand such as white water rafting, trekking or zip-lining. Trekking ranges from short walks to hilltribe villages to multi-day treks. The Flight of the Gibbon is a recommended zip-lining experience near Chiang Mai, ideal for families.

Northern Thailand is home to numerous different hill tribes who have occupied this region of Thailand, Laos, China and Burma for hundreds of years.

Hilltribe culture is completely different to that of the Thais and each tribe has its own colourful traditional dress.

There are several ways to visit hill tribe villages, ranging from very 'touristy' day trips to getting off the beaten track, staying in very basic homestays. There are also 3 or 4 great hill tribe lodges we use, which provide comfortable accommodation and genuine insights into the unique village way of life.
